REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES

The office is the first point of contact to update the school regarding absences, late arrivals or early dismissals.

SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction on the new 12-plex is complete and we're ready to welcome students!

Room #'s run from 511-16 on the lower floor and 521-526 on the upper floor so be sure to double-check your schedules!

THERE IS NO PARKING OR DROP OFF AREAS AROUND THIS BUILDING as stopping/parking here creates a dangerous backlog that puts both students and staff at risk. Thank you for your patience with the changes.

DROP OFF/PICK UP/ARRIVING ON TIME

We have an extended day schedule. We have a few classes that start at 7:00 am and we have a few classes that start after school but most of our students attend between 8:15 am and 3:14 pm. Please know that students are expected to be in their classrooms on time. (Bell schedule is provided on the first page of this newsletter).

Students should arrive at school with enough time to get organized and get to class by these times.

DROP OFF/PICK UP ZONES: We have two main areas: the front of the school and the upper parking lot.

Please understand that our drop-off and pick-up areas are for **DROP OFF AND PICK UP ONLY.**

PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN A STALL. If your schedule allows, you might consider dropping your child off a little earlier than the rush and picking up a little later. Alternatively, students are welcome to be dropped off at the Coquitlam Alliance Church at the corner of Mariner Way and Spuraway.

PARKING STALLS ARE RESTRICTED TO STAFF AND GRADE 12 STUDENTS WITH PARKING PERMITS.

Please help us as we try to maintain a safe and efficient lot for your children and our staff, thank you!

USE OF E-SCOOTERS AND E-BIKES

As part of the RCMP's ongoing strategy around providing information to parents, students and the community regarding the safe and lawful use of e-scooters/e-bikes, they have created the attached infographic that clarifies the rules and restriction around the use of e bikes and e-scooters and how that impacts school aged riders.

There is a heightened concern in the community around the safe and lawful operation of these devices. Students are expected to follow the highlighted rules and regulations including refraining from operating these devices on sidewalks, park trails, or pathways unless permitted by signs or pavement markings.

EXPECTATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR A SUCCESSFUL YEAR

As members of this school community, we have responsibilities to ourselves and to each other that go far beyond words. It is our expectation that you keep the following things first and foremost in your minds:

- Be kind and respectful of each member of this community. Be respectful of the building and be respectful of our neighbors and businesses.
- Do your best in your classes and put in the effort. Success is not automatic, and it will take work. Do not look for the easy way out. Grit and resilience are essential to achieving success both at school and the world beyond
- Student athletes are students first. If you want to represent the school and participate in athletics, you need to ensure you are taking care of your academics
- Participation in the fun stuff and the memorable events and ceremonies, including graduation events is not a right, it is a privilege earned. Students who demonstrate poor attendance and do not adhere to the Code of Conduct may find themselves not attending these milestone events
- Be exceptionally mindful of the things you do and say on social media. Think about things before you hit send.
- Do not bring vapes or any sort of smoking device to school, electronic or otherwise. The use and possession of these devices is strictly prohibited. If you are caught with a vape it will be confiscated, your parents will be notified and you will be subject to the consequences outlined in the school Code of Conduct.
- Attendance - Students are expected to be in school and on time on all days when school is in session. Research indicates that poor attendance disrupts the continuity of instruction and once lost instruction is difficult to recover. Our attendance expectations are clearly detailed on page 9 of our school planners. Planners were distributed to Grade 9's and limited copies will be available at the office.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE

Dr. Charles Best Secondary is a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) school as many of our classrooms use laptops on a regular basis. If your student does not have a device, we have a laptop loaner program operated through our school library. Students requiring a loaner laptop can come to the main office to receive a form to apply for a temporary device.

Please note this process takes a few days. Laptops will not be loaned out the same day.

NOTE: Student cell phones are not considered a learning device.

Recommended Laptop Specs include:

- A minimum of 13-inch screen
- A full-sized keyboard
- Touch screens are not necessary.
- Hard Drive of 256GB or more
- Ram of 8GB or more

Information to consider: If your child is scheduled to write a Ministry Assessment (Lit. 10, Numeracy 10, Lit. 12, DELF etc.) this year, **MAC Books are problematic** and have created stressful situations for students in the form of glitches and delays in completing the Assessment.

CELL PHONE EXPECTATIONS

At Dr. Charles Best Secondary, responsible cell phone use is essential to fostering an environment of respect and academic excellence. Teachers will review these expectations with their Advisory classes on September 8th as well as in individual classes to ensure every student is aware of them.

Cell Phone Language from the Code of Conduct reads:

Personal Digital Devices in Schools:

All cellular phones or similar personal communication devices are to be appropriately stored during class time. Digital devices of any kind are only to be used **at the discretion of your teacher** when identified as appropriate for your learning environment or because of unique circumstances. Any use of personal digital devices at school is subject to all other expectations for conduct and use of technology, including AP 140.2 Digital Responsibility for Students. Many teachers use Cell Phone Hotels in their classrooms to store them during class time. Those students will be required to place their device in the hotel for the duration of the class. The recommendation is that students lock their phones up in their locker for safe keeping throughout the day.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

There is no specific school supply list. Please bring basic supplies on the first day of regular classes including your personal device (laptop). Individual teachers will specify if other items are required.

SCHOOL FEES

Student Activity fees for the 2026-2027 school year are \$45.00

A word about the Student Activity Fee

This is a fee we collect that helps pay for important items and activities throughout the school year that otherwise would not happen. They include:

SCHOOL LOCKERS * ONLINE SIGN UP THIS YEAR

Students have all been emailed home sign up information and link. Please note, the link is for student use only.

After a brief glitch, the sign-up program is up and running.

- Students are responsible for the locker they choose all year and will return the lock and orange combination tag to the main office in June.
- **NOTE:** personal locks are **NOT** permitted on regular lockers. If used, they will be removed at the owner's expense.
- Small blue lockers located outside the large gym are for PE students ONLY. These lockers do not have locks attached so belongings are left at the owner's risk. Personal locks *may be used* on these lockers *ONLY* and must be removed at the end of first semester so second semester PE students can be afforded the same opportunity.
- Locker changes are not permitted online. Please come to the office for assistance.

FORM UPDATES FOR 2026-2027

As our district continues to move towards digitization of student forms to ensure the confidentiality of personal information, parents/guardians will be required to complete some on-line forms and to submit an information verification form during the first few weeks.

Most forms and fees will be completed via School CashOnline accounts here <https://sd43.schoolcashonline.com/> or by clicking on 'Parent E-Forms' on our website homepage. Forms include school Policy, School Volunteer form, Volunteer Driver Application.

Emergency Release forms: sent home with Grade 9 students on September 3 and will be sent home with Grade 10-12 students on September 8th. We are requesting these be **returned no later than Friday, September 11** so we have the most up to date information possible in the event of an emergency.

Student Information Verification forms will be published to Parent MYED portals for review closer to the end of September. Information coming soon!

Medical Forms: It is extremely important we have the most up to date information for students **ASAP** with medical or life-threatening alerts **EACH YEAR**. Parents, please navigate to our school website homepage to find these important forms under 'Parent E-Forms'. Please fill out applicable forms as soon as possible and have the forms returned to the office so we have the most up to date information for our staff. Thank you for helping us with this!

STUDENT VEHICLE REGISTRATION

There will once again be limited student parking **FOR GRADE 12 STUDENTS** this year. Limited parking spots will be available for **GRADE 12 students ONLY** in the upper parking lot. Vehicle registration forms will be handed out to grade 12's during their Advisory/Homeroom class on **Tuesday September 8th**.

Please review the process in place to obtain a permit:

- Application form must be filled out in full and signed by a parent/guardian.
- Form must be presented in person to Ms. Wynne in the office. *DO NOT DROP OFF FORM AT FRONT RECEPTION.*
- Only 1 pass will be distributed per student. If you drive more than one vehicle it is the student's responsibility to switch the pass from car to car.
- Present proof of your valid 'N' license. 'L' licenses are not permitted for the application process.
- Applications will be reviewed by Administration, and a \$25 refundable deposit will be uploaded to SCO accounts once permit is approved. An email alert will notify parent/guardians once the fee is available.
- Once deposit is paid, students will be contacted to come to the office to pick up their pass. We will do our best to take care of this as quickly as possible but there will be a short wait due to volume of applications.
- Once passes are returned to the office at the end of the school year, \$25 will be refunded to families.
- Students **MUST** display their permit in their vehicle and abide by parking guidelines or will run the risk of losing their parking privileges.

CAFETERIA

Our school has a cafeteria operated by Canuel Caterers which offers hot and cold options for breakfast, lunch and snack items throughout the year.

Opening day is planned for **Wednesday, September 9th** from 8:00am-1:00pm with limited options available.
