Workplace 11	A little easier	Expect about 30 minutes a week outside of class
Foundations 11	About the same as Foundations 10	Expect about 20 minutes a day outside of class
Pre-Calculus 11	Quite difficult	Expect about 45 minutes a day outside of class
Foundations 12	Similar to Foundations 11	Expect about 30 minutes a day outside of class
Statistics 12	Quite difficult	Expect about 45 minutes a day outside of class
Pre-Calculus 12	A level up from Pre-Calculus 11	Expect about 1 hour a day outside of class
Calculus 12	Very difficult	Expect about 1+ hour a day outside of class

Advanced Placement

- AP exams are available for students who are excelling in a certain subject
- After finishing the Grade 12 level of the course, students can write the AP Exam for that subject.
- If students get over Level 3, they can get credit for the first year university level of that course

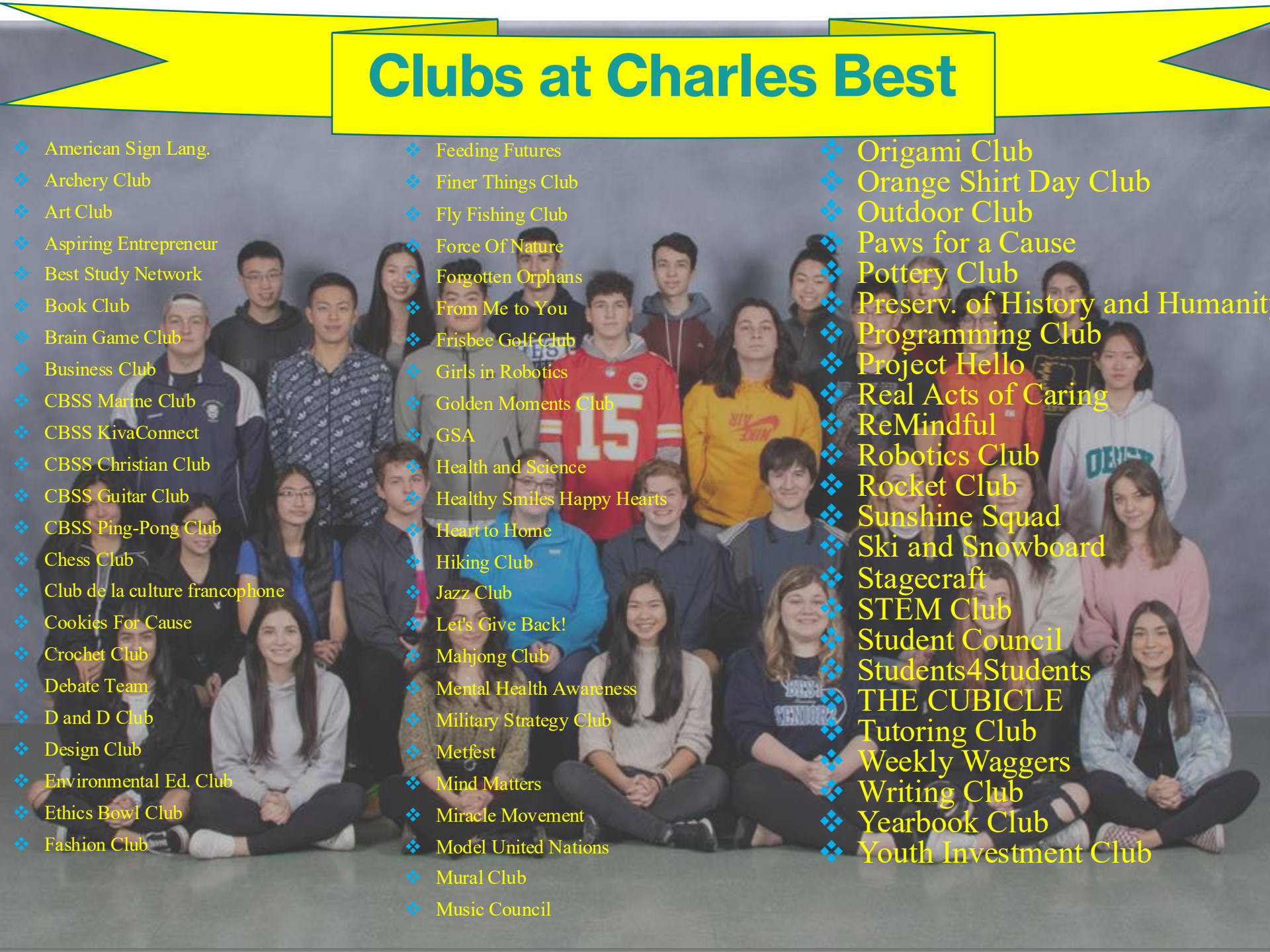

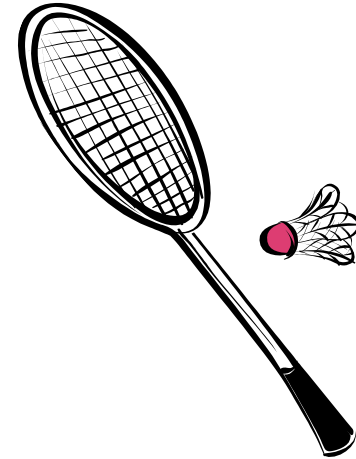

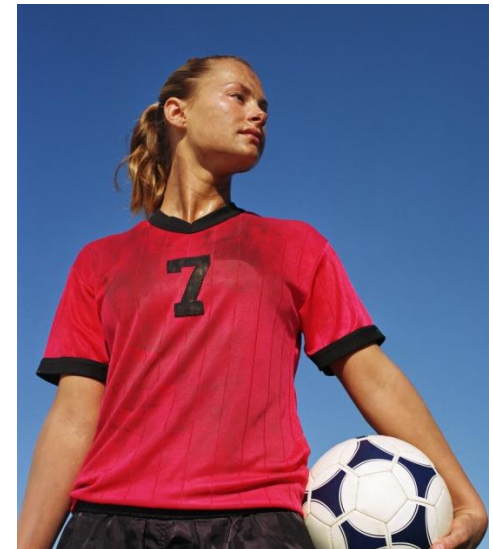

Requirements: The BC Ministry of Education requires students to complete a **MINIMUM of 60 credits** (each course has a 6-credit value unless otherwise specified). **Four courses (16 credits) must be completed at the grade 12 level (which includes English 12).** Most students graduate with more than 60 credits. One course designated **Applied Design, Skills and Technologies (AGST)** or **Arts Education (AE)** must also be taken at the Grade 10, 11 or 12 level. For more information, please refer to the Course Planning book on the Charles Best website.

- Goal Setting:** Research indicates that when goals are written down, people are more likely to achieve them.
